Dalston Theatre

The Dalston Theatre which stood at 12
Dalston Lane had a rich and varied history.
Built in 1886, to designs by Alfred Brandreth,
the North London Colosseum and
Amphitheatre was initially built as a circus.

It hosted the circus of *Sir Robert Fossett* whose great grandson, *Bobby Roberts*, still runs a circus today.

It became the *Dalston Theatre of Varieties* in 1898, and a new grand entrance was designed. As a Victorian variety theatre, it hosted Hackney's own international star of the music hall *Marie Lloyd*.

It was converted into a 2,500-seat cinema in 1920 at huge expense. Opened by Hackney's then Mayor, Herbert Morrison, and Lord Beaverbrook it was described as "the greatest cinema in the British Empire if not the world".





